

Temporary Art: Nature's Art Suncatcher



What you need:

- Water
- Container
- Natural ingredients

Directions:

- Give children a bag or basket to collect a variety of shapes, colors, and sized natural objects. This could be plants, leaves, flowers, fruit slices, berries, bird seed, acorns, nuts.
- Choose a container. Plastic lids, pie plates, pans, silicone mold, cupcake tin, all work well. Keep in mind the larger the mold the longer it will take to freeze.
- Once ready to assemble, fill your container with enough water that your elements will be covered but keep it shallow enough to freeze. For a clearer suncatcher boil your water before adding it to your mold. Now arrange your natural objects however you like!
- Add a loop of string or ribbon to create a built in hanger once frozen. It can be hung in a tree or from the porch.
- Freeze it! If it's cold enough leave it outside overnight. Otherwise, carefully place your tin/mold into the freezer.
- After your suncatcher has frozen, carefully remove from its mold and hang!
