LANDSCAPE COLLAGE WITH

HAND-PRINTED PAPERS ON THE GEL PLATE

In this two-part class, you'll first experiment with printing on both opaque and transparent papers using stencils, mark-making tools, and a limited color palette to create cohesive textures inspired by sky, water, landforms, foliage, and sunlight. In the second part, you'll design and assemble a simple landscape by cutting, tearing, and layering your prints. We'll explore aerial perspective and composition; however, whether your piece is realistic or imaginative, it will be uniquely yours—built from the papers you created. WHEEL THROWN PUMPKIN WORKSHOP

Celebrate fall with this special 3-part class and learn to make your very own ceramic pumpkin on the wheel! In the first class you will create a closed orb on the wheel. Then you will be shown techniques to alter, shape and add a stem. In the second class you will trim and "carve" your leather-hard pumpkin, adding a few finishing details. The pumpkins will be allowed to dry and then put in the bisque kiln. The third and final class will be dedicated to painting your bisqued pumpkin whatever color and style you imagine. Although this class is open to all levels, previous centering experience is helpful with this technique. Pumpkin pinch pots are also an option for the beginner. 
