Raku Pottery Workshop Fall 2026

Instructor: Ann Buchau

Dates & Times:

Wednesdays, September 9 & 16, 6-9 pm, at the Arts Center

Saturday, September 26, 9 am - 3 pm, Raku firing off site

Ages: 14 and up

Class fee: \$65 members / \$80 non-members

Raku is a thrilling, quick-fire ceramics technique originating from 16th-century Japan. Pots are pulled from a glowing red hot kiln (about 1850F) and plunged into enclosed metal cans filled with organic matter to starve them of oxygen. The resulting smoke, flame, and rapid cooling create unpredictable, stunning surface effects and often metallic colors. In this 3-day class you will be guided through the entire creative and firing process of raku pottery. Emphasis will be on creating pieces using a variety of handbuilding techniques, but experienced potters may choose to use the wheel. All tools and materials are provided. No experience necessary.

Plein Air Painting Workshop

Dates & Times: Two days, 3 hours each day:

Saturdays, September 12 & 13, 1-4 pm

Ages: Adults (14 y/o)

Experience Level: beginner, intermediate, and advanced

Basic drawing skills recommended

Medium: Oil painting

Fee: \$36 members / \$45 non-members

Step outside the studio and learn to paint from life! In this two-day *En Plein Air* workshop, artist Kimberly Rossiter will guide students through the process of capturing natural light, color, and atmosphere while painting outdoors. Throughout the workshop, students will explore limited palettes, color relationships, value, composition, tone, edges, and paint handling while learning how to work with the constantly changing light of the outdoors. Each student will work toward completing a 5" x 7", 6" x 8", or 8" x 10" painting. A complete materials list will be provided upon registration. Some easels and equipment may be available to borrow.

6-Week Wheel Throwing Class for All Levels

Instructor: Ann Buchau

Date: Wednesdays, September 30; Oct 7, 14, 21, 28; November 4

Time: 6:00-8:30 pm

Ages: Adult/Teen

Fee: \$120 members / \$150 non-members

Learn how to throw basic forms using the potter's wheel. Your instructor will guide you step by step as you learn how to wedge, center and create simple vessels. You will also learn trimming techniques and how to successfully glaze your pots. Students enrolled in this class will also have the option to come in during a designated time on Tuesdays (6-8:30 pm) or Friday (1-4 pm) to practice and work on their pieces. (Although there will be a monitor, there is no instructor for the open studio.) Total class time is 12.5 hours with the option of an additional 25 hours of open studio time during the class session. All tools and materials are provided. Sorry! Class is full.
